AUMC DISAFFILIATION INFORMATION and TEAM UPDATES: Submitted by Bill Heard

Since our Church Conference vote to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church on July 24, 2023, we have completed the necessary legal and conference requirements.

- We have established a new religious Corporation and Board of Trustees. Our new corporate name is Avoca Methodist Church Inc.
- 2. We had the property abstracts updated to allow property transfer.
- 3. We have submitted the historical document files to UMC archives as required.
- 4. We submitted certified copies of 2022 and 2023 financial documents.
- 5. We submitted our property transfer documents and the disaffiliation agreement to UMC.
- 6. We submitted the required monetary funds.

With the completion of these items, we had prepared our church for the District Conference vote on October 14, 2023, to allow disaffiliation from UMC. 57 total churches were being considered and the vote approved proceeding with the disaffiliation.

We are waiting for New York State to transfer the property deeds to our new corporation, Avoca Methodist Church Inc. The UMC disaffiliation is not complete until the property is transferred. This has been taking several months.

We need to continue to keep our church, congregation, pastor, and church/conference leadership in prayer.

Once we are separated from UMC, we can look forward to our future with the Global Methodist Church.

Projects Completed:

- Survey of items at the Kanona Church for items that may be donated to AMC.
- Transfer of CD funds to Ron for disaffiliation payment.
- Replaced drive belt and deck belt on the 2011 Cub Cadet tractor.
- The former Kanona Food Pantry moved to the back left classroom.

Old Business:

- Gary to do staining on the upper trim on the church. Lower trim can be done anytime. Trying to schedule for mid to late September but this may be a next spring project.
- Church road sign replacement is on hold until after our disaffiliation is completed.

New Business:

- Approved the Board of Elections use of the Church for the following 2024 election dates: April 4, 2024; June 25, 2024, and Nov. 5, 2024---6 AM to 9 PM
- Approved the use of the church for the Charge Conference on November 18, 2023.
- Need to measure kitchen door and windows for new replacements at the parsonage. (update: The purchase of a new door and two new windows was approved by the Board of Trustees on October 11, 2023 by a text vote and have been purchased and installed.)
- Approved the request by Janet to borrow a table from the church, for a craft show, on October 6^{th.}

A Special Trustee Meeting was held on October 4, 2023 to approve an Eagle Scout project for Ian Bennett. Ian presented the plan for a Prayer Garden around the flagpole. The project was approved and Don Loveland is donating the necessary funds to support the project in memory of Theresa Loveland.

TREASURER'S REPORT September 2023 – Ron Salles

We continue to carry a reserve in the General Fund. The size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred, but most of the time there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time. We also have paid our ministry shares to the conference. Praise God and thank you!

On the Mission Fund side, we no longer have any mission reserves, we are concentrating on our local missions this year as our missions' projects; The Ramp Mission, aka, The Ramp Guys, and The Lighthouse Mission, aka The Lighthouse Christmas. We were able to contribute a sizeable amount to both missions in September. Praise God and thank you!

The Campership Fund is mainly earned from the empty bottle and can drive, and some direct donations. There is a reserve that is currently building.

As the disaffiliation process continues, we have paid the required fees to the conference. The Special Session has voted to allow us to disaffiliate. Currently we are waiting on the New York State Courts to transfer the deeds. In the meantime, we will be transferring our business accounts to the new church entity, Avoca Methodist Church.

Believing what you want to believe to get to heaven is very appealing to many people but Bible study will again show that "broad tent" believe what you want to believe approaches to salvation are not the WAY. Regardless of what we might hear, Christians realize that GOD's WAY is the only WAY.

RECIPE CORNER

EASY (Microwave) CHRISTMAS DIVINITY

Ingredients:

- 2 cups white granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup water
- 1/3 cup light corn syrup
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 egg whites
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup pecans or nuts of your choice chopped

Instructions:

Combine sugar, water, corn syrup and salt in a glass casserole dish. Cover with saran wrap and microwave on high for 5 minutes. Remove from microwave and take off saran wrap. Stir well and return to microwave uncovered. Cook on high for another 4 to 5 minutes until reaches hard ball stage when a little is dropped in cold water. Remove and cool about 4 minutes. Beat egg whites until stiff with mixer.

Pour sugar mixture over egg whites beating constantly with mixer until mixture starts to lose its gloss and holds together. About 4 or 5 minutes. Stir in vanilla and nuts. Drop by teaspoonful onto wax paper. Makes about 25 pieces depending on size you make them

CHRISTMAS CHEX MIX (Great Gifts for Neighbors or Co-Workers)

Ingredients:

- 3 cups Chex (rice or corn)
- 2 cups Cheerios
- 1-2 cups pretzel sticks (broken in half)
- 1 cup Christmas M&M's
- 10 ounces white chocolate (I used Ghirardelli wafers)

Instructions:

COMBINE the cereals, pretzels and M&M's together in a large bowl. Mix together.

MELT the white chocolate chips or wafers in a microwave-safe bowl. Cook in 30 second intervals in the microwave until smooth. Be careful not to overcook the chocolate or it will burn.

POUR the chocolate over the cereal mixture and stir until well coated. Then spread the mixture out onto a piece of wax paper or parchment paper (I like to set on a cookie sheet).

COOL Let cool for about 15 minutes (or until the chocolate has hardened completely).

Extra Mix-In's

Use peanut or peanut butter M&M's instead of regular, or even a mixture of both.

Add in peanuts, pecans or walnuts for even more salty flavor.

Mini pretzels will work in place of pretzel sticks.

Mix in some holiday sprinkles to make it even more festive.

Sometimes I add in some mini marshmallows if we have them in the pantry.

Make this for any holiday with different color M&M's. Whether it's Halloween, 4th of July or you're making Valentine Chex Mix, this recipe works perfect!
