TREASURER'S REPORT January 2024 – Ron Salles

We carried forward a reserve from 2023 in the General Fund. This reserve was large enough to be able to transfer some funds to the Mission Fund to start 2024 with some areas funded. Normally the size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred, but most of the time there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time. We will continue to pay some retiree and retirement fees to the conference until the disaffiliation is final.

On the Mission Fund side, we have taken some of the 2023 General Fund reserves and funded some mission reserves for 2024. Again for 2024, we are concentrating on our local missions this year as our missions' projects; The Campership Fund, The Ramp Mission, (The Ramp Guys), The Lighthouse Mission, (The Lighthouse Christmas), and The Avoca – Kanona Food Pantry. We are also looking into a yet to be determined mission project for 2024.

RECIPE CORNER

Creamy White Chicken Chili

Pastor Barre Butts

Ingredients:

- 1 pound boneless chicken breasts, cut into ½ inch cubes
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 and ¹/₂ teaspoons garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 2 cans (15.5 oz) great northern beans, rinsed & drained
- 1 can (14.5 oz) chicken broth
- 2 cans (4 oz) chopped green chiles
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- ¹/₂ teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 cup sour cream
- ¹/₂ cup heavy whipping cream
- Optional: tortilla chips, shredded cheddar cheese, sliced seeded jalapeno pepper

Directions:

In a large saucepan, sauté the chicken, onion and garlic powder in oil until chicken is no longer pink. Add beans, broth, chiles and seasonings. Bring to a boil.

Reduce heat; simmer uncovered, for 30 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in sour cream and heavy cream. If desired, top with tortilla chips, cheese and jalapenos.

Macaroni Coleslaw Beverly Young

Ingredients:

- 1 package (7 ounces) ring macaroni or ditalini
- 1 package (14 ounces) coleslaw mix
- 2 medium onions, finely chopped
- 2 celery ribs, finely chopped
- 1 medium cucumber, finely chopped
- 1 medium green pepper, finely chopped
- 1 can (8 ounces) whole water chestnuts, drained & chopped (optional)

Dressing:

- 1 and ¹/₂ cups Miracle Whip Light 1/3 cup sugar ¹/₄ cup cider vinegar ¹/₂ teaspoon salt
- ² teaspoon sait
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions:

Cook macaroni according to package directions; drain and rinse in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl; add the coleslaw mix, onions, celery, cucumber, green pepper & water chestnuts. In a small bowl, whisk the dressing ingredients. Pour over salad; toss to coat. Cover & refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Yield: 16 servings
