TREASURER'S REPORT January 2024 – Ron Salles

We are carrying a modest reserve in the General Fund. The size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred, but most of the time there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time.

As of March 21, 2024 we are officially disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. We will no longer be paying retiree and retirement fees or any other fees to the conference. Although on March 19, 2024 we have been accepted to join the Global Methodist Church (more to come as we receive it), we are currently operating as an independent church. We have a new federal ID number (EIN) and a new NYS Tax Exempt Number for the Avoca Methodist Church, Inc. This means we must change all of our business accounts over to the new name and tax numbers. We are currently working on doing just that. This will not change under the Global Methodist Church.

On the Mission Fund side, we also have some modest mission reserves as we build for the missions later in the year. This year we are concentrating on our local missions as our missions' projects; The Campership Fund, The Ramp Mission, (The Ramp Guys), The Lighthouse Mission, (The Lighthouse Christmas), and The Avoca – Kanona Food Pantry. We are also looking into a mission project for the upcoming school year.

LANGUAGE OF JESUS - In order to understand what Jesus is talking about in the Bible we must learn the language of the Bible and specifically we must learn the language of Jesus. Effective Bible study requires students to know the meaning of the words Jesus is speaking. Many of the words used by Jesus in the Bible have a symbolic and spiritual meaning rather than a worldly meaning as defined in Webster's dictionary. We can learn the language of Jesus only from Bible study. Not knowing the language of Jesus causes huge problems with Bible interpretation and understanding the teachings of Jesus.

There are many examples of words in the Bible used by Jesus that require Jesus' definition. One example is when Jesus encountered the lady at the well (John 4:40). Jesus spoke about water. Everybody knows the definition of water. But Jesus introduces us to the word "living water." Most new Bible readers never heard of "living water." "Living water" is not defined in Webster's dictionary. What does Jesus mean when he talks

about "living water?" Jesus begins to define "living water" by saying drinking living water allows you to live forever. Obviously when Jesus talks about "living water" he is not talking about common ordinary water which we all know will not allow us to live forever.

In Matthew 7:16 Jesus says "by their fruit ye shall know them." Again Jesus is not talking about fruit. Also when Jesus in John 21:17 commands to "feed my sheep" he is not talking about food. When Jesus says love your neighbor he is not talking about showing love to your neighbor in a worldly way such as giving your neighbor money so your neighbor could live a money free happy life as a non-believer. The list of examples of the language of Jesus goes on. It takes effort but We must all learn the language of Jesus only from the Bible.

RECIPE CORNER

Macaroni Coleslaw Beverly Young

Ingredients:

1 package (7 ounces) ring macaroni or ditalini

1 package (14 ounces) coleslaw mix

2 medium onions, finely chopped

2 celery ribs, finely chopped

1 medium cucumber, finely chopped

1 medium green pepper, finely chopped

1 can (8 ounces) whole water chestnuts, drained & chopped (optional)

Dressing:

1 and ½ cups Miracle Whip Light 1/3 cup sugar ¼ cup cider vinegar ½ teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon pepper

Directions:

Cook macaroni according to package directions; drain and rinse in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl; add the coleslaw mix, onions, celery, cucumber, green pepper & water chestnuts. In a small bowl, whisk the dressing ingredients. Pour over salad; toss to coat. Cover & refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

Yield: 16 servings

"Lazy Man's" Pie - Peach Cobbler

1 stick butter or margarine

1 cup milk

1 cup sugar

1 cup flour

1 tsp baking powder

Dash salt

1 qt fruit, sweetened (peach, cherries, blackberries etc.)

Melt butter in baking pan.

Mix flour, sugar, baking powder, salt and milk. Pour batter in pan on top of butter; cover with fruit. Do not stir; batter will rise to top as it bakes and absorbs the flavor of fruit.

Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

Serve warm, with whipped cream or ice cream.
