TREASURER'S REPORT July 2025 - Ron Salles

We continue to carry a reserve in the General Fund. The size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred. Currently there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time.

On the Mission Fund side, we have no reserves in the mission fund as we build the funds for this year. We are borrowing from the General Fund reserves to fund the current Mission Fund needs. This year we have concentrated on our local missions as our missions' projects; The Campership Fund (Scouts), The Ramp Mission (The Ramp Guys), The Lighthouse Mission (The Lighthouse Christmas), and The Avoca – Kanona Food Pantry. Jane's initial estimate of how many people she would be helping has tripled and we have increased our funding to help. We have also placed a donation cart for food and cash in the Narthex.

The Capital Project Fund campaign to repair and repave the parking lot continues. The work was completed the first week in June and what a blessing it is! The goal is \$50,000.00 for this capital project. As of August 10, 2025, \$41,395.40 has been raised so far. That's 82.8%. The Administrative Council didn't seek a bank loan but borrowed from our own reserves earmarked for other projects. So we still need to replenish these reserves to \$8,604.60 more. We are almost to our goal! Keep up the giving in this area!

BOARD OF TRUSTEES Bill Heard

Trustees Meeting and follow up items from July 1, 2025, meeting.

Members present: Fred & Marge Wood, Gary Weldy, Don Loveland, Bruce English, Janet English, and Bill Heard.

- The trustees approved proceeding with the replacement of the church sign via a text vote on July 21, 2025. The sign was ordered on 29 Jul 2025 for a total cost of \$4275 pending final freight cost. As a memorial, Aaron Benton is going to make a substantial donation toward the cost of the new sign.
- The new road signs are completed and will be located at the end of Michigan Hollow Road and the end of County Rt 6/ Rt 415.
- The trustee approved via a text vote to spending \$500-\$700 to replace Pastor Barre's 20-year-old washer when it fails.
- Gravel backfill around the parking lot was completed on Wednesday, August 12, 2025.
- It has been decided to add two low rise steps and handrail to the food pantry door to help with the entryway egress.

- Don Loveland supplied a barrel and drainpipe, and Tim Hubbard donated the stone to install a barrel for the back eve downspout that was causing icing problems for the food pantry door. This was completed on August 12, 2025.
- The church and parsonage will be power washed on September 3, 2025.

The next meeting will be on September 11, 2025.

MERCHANT CARD PROGRAM

How can it be September already when it seems like Christmas was yesterday? After Labor Day, the stores, catalogs, TV and radio ads, etc. start to focus on the things we, (receiver or gift giver), can not live without this Christmas. We struggle to find the perfect item not knowing sizes, color preferences, what's "in", what they already have, or what they would never use. Many families have members spread all across the country where they have had to relocate to find jobs, colleges, or a better climate for health issues. Fed-ex, United Parcel Service, and the US Post Office costs are continuing to increase each year.

As we age, it is increasingly difficult to shop in the big-box stores, deal with crowds, and/or navigate the internet to make on-line purchases. Over the years many of us have moved to purchasing gift cards.

You have seen the Merchant Card due dates in the bulletin inserts and newsletters. The Avoca Methodist Church is a member of Raise Right, a fund raising organization for non-profits which

provides a easy and efficient way to earn money for specific programs or for items that cannot be purchased using regular church moneys.

Raise Right provides a list of approximately 1,000 vendors from which gift cards may be purchased. Each vendor lists the percentage of discount they provide us on each card sold. Therefore, if you purchase a gift card the amount earned by the church would depend on the type of card. If you purchased a \$100 gift card, the card you receive will be for \$100. Some examples of what the church might earn on that \$100 card:

Depending on the vendor, cards can be purchased for \$10, \$25, \$50 or \$100. Almost all the vendors offer a \$25 card. The master vendor list indicates which amounts their cards are available.

The Merchant Card orders are submitted the third Thursday of each month. Orders must be received in the office by 10:00 AM. The cards are normally received by the following Tuesday and are available the 4th Sunday unless you make arrangements to pick them up early.

The master list and order forms are on the table outside the office. Please feel to contact me if you have questions or need additional information.

Please consider using the church's merchant card program for gift giving and personal purchases. The food for the picnic before the Puffers concert and the base money for the Puffers were provided by the Merchant Card Program. Since 2015, the approximate \$13,000 earned has made possible many concerts, dinners, picnics, mission support, etc. that otherwise could not have happened.

RECIPE CORNER

Gooey Raspberry White Chocolate Cookies Pastor Barre

Ingredients:

- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup fresh raspberries
- 1 cup white chocolate chips
- ½ cup white chocolate chunks

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper
- In a large bowl, cream together the butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in the vanilla extract.
- In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt. Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, mixing until just combined.
- Gently fold in the raspberries, white chocolate chips and white chocolate chunks
- Scoop dough onto prepared baking sheets, spacing each about 2 inches apart
- Bake for 12-15 minutes, or until the edges are lightly golden. Allow cookies to cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.
