TREASURER'S REPORT November 2025 – Ron Salles

We continue to carry a reserve in the General Fund. The size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred, currently there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time.

On the Mission Fund side, we have a modest reserve in the mission fund. We transferred some funds from the General Fund reserves to fund the current Mission Fund needs. This year we have concentrated on our local missions as our missions' projects; The Campership Fund (Scouts), The Ramp Mission (The Ramp Guys), The Lighthouse Mission (The Lighthouse Christmas), The Vincent House, and The Avoca

– Kanona Food Pantry. Jane K's initial estimate of how many people she would be helping has tripled and we have increased our funding to help. We have also placed a donation cart for food and cash in the Narthex.

The Capital Project Fund campaign to repair and repave the parking lot is now closed. The work was completed the first week in June and what a blessing it is! The goal is \$50,000.00 for this capital project. The Administrative Council didn't seek a bank loan but borrowed from our own reserves earmarked for other projects. The Administrative Council voted to fund the remaining goal amount from our General Fund reserves. **THE PARKING LOT IS NOW PAID!** Any money that comes in marked for the parking lot will be counted as Mission Funds from here on out. What a great blessing it was not to need to take out a bank loan! Thank you all for your contribution!

RAMP MISSION **Adam & Jackie Ormsby**

The Ramp Guys continued to move forward with good news on all fronts.

The Ramp Guys successfully hosted the Retired Seniors Volunteer Program (RSVP) orientation at Avoca Methodist Church on October 31, 2025. This event resulted in the registration of 11 new RSVP members into The Ramp Guys's program, which helps secure funding from The Office for the Aging and support The Ramp Guys's mission.

Outreach to the Hornell BOCES program has created a successful partnership by serving the larger Hornell area. In the process, 26 BOCES students in the carpentry program are learning new skills and The Ramp Guys share their experiences and example of "Doing Good" for those in need in our area. So far two ramps have been built in the Hornell area with their assistance.

The end of the fiscal year has resulted in The Ramp Guys using every dollar of its yearly allocation of funds from the county. Since October 2025 to present, we have completed 8 new ramps. We are looking forward to January 1st when our new contract with the Office For The Aging can be put in place. Until then, The Ramp Guys will be on winter break and considering emergency ramp builds only.

In the past year, our Five Rivers Council has merged with Buffalo District, and as of now we are known as the Great Falls Council. To add, as of December 1, our Cub program has increased from 6 Cubs to 11 Cubs, and our Scouting America Troop 32 will be increasing from 6 to 8 Scouts. National has approved a family program like our Cub Program.

WEATHER FOLKLORE

Long before meteorologists reported the weather, people made forecasts based on their observations of the sky, animals, and nature. Much of the traditional weather lore is surprisingly accurate.

“Red sky at night, sailors delight.

Red sky in morning, sailors take warning.”

People relied on this weather saying to navigate their ships, plant crops, and plan activities. It has been a common adage through the ages.

In the Bible, there is a passage in which Jesus says, “When it is evening, you say, ‘It will be fair weather; for the sky is red.’ And in the morning, ‘It will be stormy today, for the sky is red and threatening.’” (Matthew 16:2-3)

This classic rhyme is based on how sunlight interacts with weather systems. A red sky at sunset means clear weather is likely ahead, while a red sunrise signals an approaching storm.

“If you hear thunder in winter, expect snow soon”

Thunder in colder months often signals a rapid change in temperature. Meteorologists recognize this as a sign of an approaching cold front, which can bring snow within a few days.

***“A Ring Around the Moon Means
Rain or Snow is Coming”***

A ring around the sun or moon is caused by light from those bodies passing through ice crystals in the upper atmosphere (light doesn’t come from the moon). These ice crystals have either been blown over the tops of high, approaching storm clouds, or from high cirrus clouds, which can be the first indication of an incoming low-pressure system. So when you see a ring, prepare for precipitation.

***“When Leaves Turn Upside Down,
A Storm is Coming”***

Tree leaves curl or flip before a storm due to changes in humidity and wind patterns. Scientists explain that increased moisture causes the softer undersides of leaves to absorb water and curl upward.

***“If the Goose Honks High, Fair Weather
If the Goose Honks Low, Foul Weather.”***

This proverb has nothing to do with the pitch of a goose’s honk, but rather the altitude of its flight. If the goose “honks high” or is flying at high altitude it’s an indication of high barometric pressure, and

therefore good weather. If it’s flying lower in the sky, the barometric pressure is low and poor weather is foretold. This is because geese are incredibly adept at flying with optimum air density. When air pressure is high, that optimum level is high in the sky, and the reverse is true for low pressure.

***“When your joints all start to ache,
rainy weather is at stake.”***

This proverb is pointing to joint pain in humans.

Did you have an old uncle whose bad knee could predict a storm? While there has been research done on how weather affects humans, it’s all still just theory.

The hypothesis that is most supported by the scientific community is that low pressure (meaning less force on your body/joints) allows tissue to expand, which can put pressure on your joints. So when your bum knee aches a little more for seemingly no reason, look to the skies and prepare for rain the next day or two.

“Woolly bear caterpillars: winter predictors?”

The woolly bear caterpillar, or the woolly worm, as it is sometimes known in the south, is a common “predictor” of winter weather.

According to folklore, you can predict the severity of the winter season based on the size and location of the woolly bear caterpillar’s brown band. The wider the brown band, the milder the winter will be. The longer the black bands on the caterpillar, the harsher the winter will be.

Finally, the position of the widest black band is supposedly related to when in the season the harshest part of winter will be. If the widest black band starts at the head end, the beginning of winter will be harsher, and vice versa.

This is a fun way to predict the winter and see if it will come true, but the reality is that the coloring of the caterpillar is based on its age, length of feeding time, and species.

Although they cannot compare to modern meteorology in terms of scientific accuracy, these old-fashioned winter weather folklore sayings are relics of the past and are fading fast in an ever-increasing modern world. The knowledge and wisdom given to us by past generations is something we should cherish and keep alive forever.

RECIPE CORNER

THREE-BEAN CHILI

Dorene Pierce

Ingredients:

2 lbs. ground beef
2 medium onions, diced
16 oz. jar medium salsa
2 pkgs. dry chili mix
2 16 oz. cans red kidney beans, drained
2 16 oz. cans cannellini beans, drained
2 16 oz. cans white kidney, or great northern
beans, drained
28 oz. can crushed tomatoes
16 oz. can diced tomatoes
2 tsp. sugar

Directions:

1. Brown beef and onions in skillet
2. Combine all ingredients in 6-qt. slow cooker or in 2 4-5-qt cookers
3. Cover. Cook on low 8-10 hours
4. Serve with chopped raw onion and/or shredded cheddar cheese

Note: This recipe can be cut in half without injuring the flavor, if you don't have a cooker large enough to handle the full amount. Also, any combination of small beans may be used.

SLOW COOKER AMISH CORN CHOWDER

Ingredients:

4 cups fresh or frozen corn kernels
1 medium onion, diced
2 medium potatoes, peeled and diced
3 cups chicken or vegetable broth
1 cup heavy cream
4 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 tsp salt
½ tsp black pepper
½ tsp smoked paprika
2 tbsp butter
2 tbsp all-purpose flour
2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley (for garnish)

Directions:

1. Combine corn, onion, potatoes, broth, garlic, salt, pepper and paprika in slow cooker
2. Cover and cook on low for 6-8 hours until potatoes are tender
3. Make roux: melt butter, stir in flour, cook for 1-2 mins. Gradually whisk in cream
4. Stir cream mixture into slow cooker and mix well
5. Add bacon, stir, and cook on high for 30 mins.
6. Serve hot, garnish with parsley and enjoy !!
